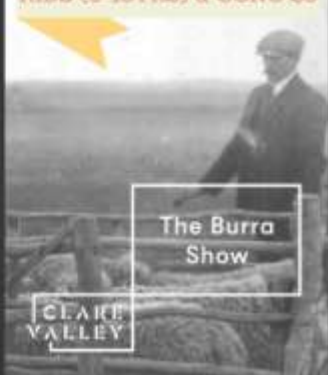

Exhibitors are requested to nominate breed & colour when filling out entry form. Diseased birds will be removed from shed and any eggs will be destroyed.

All birds are the responsibility of the exhibitor and we encourage all exhibitors to water & feed their birds upon completion of judging. Birds may only be handled by the **Judge, Owner or Convenor**, if a problem arises with any bird. We encourage anyone with an interest in poultry or persons that are members of any poultry clubs to participate in the show.

Convenors and stewards are not responsible for any loss or damage.

Please indicate on entry form if running for the N.A.S.A or N.A.S.A junior Aggregate. Adults must attend 3 shows. Juniors 5 – 17 years & under on day of show must attend at least 2 shows. Champion poultry bird of show now includes Champion junior & champion waterfowl.

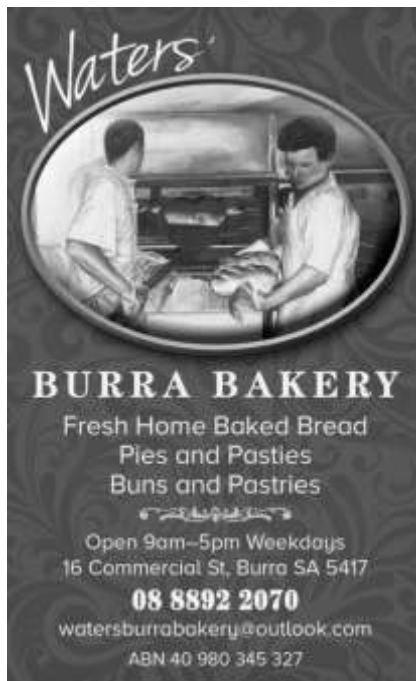

Note: This recipe is from the Cornish Pasty Association [www.cornishpastyassociation.co.uk] which gives the following information.

Cornish pasties were awarded the Protected Geographical Indication (PGI) in 2011 and need to be made to the following specifications.

A genuine Cornish pasty has a distinctive “D” shape and is crimped on one side, never on top. The filling is made up of beef, swede, potato, onion and seasoning. The pastry case is golden in colour, savoury, glazed with milk or egg and robust enough to retain its shape through the cooking and cooling process without splitting or cracking. The pastry is slow-baked and no artificial flavourings or additives must be used. Never attempt to add carrot, this is sacrilege!

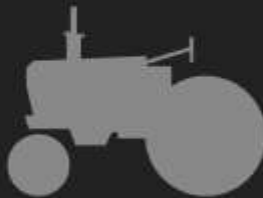

REGULATIONS

1. In classes where prizes are awarded for highest number of points, will be allotted as follows, 1st 5 points 2nd 3 points 3rd 1 point. In the event of a tie the exhibitor taking the most 1st prizes shall be the winner.
2. Prices for admission to the grounds are as follows: Members and subscribers (including vehicle) free, on presentation of Member ticket, Adult non member \$10, Pensioner with card \$5.00, Children 5 yrs to 15 yrs \$5.00, Preschool free, and cars free.
3. The President or Officer appointed by the society may withdraw any exhibit from being judged without any reason being given.
4. As soon as the judges' decision is given, the name of the exhibitor may be placed on the exhibit, and if same is for sale a price may be fixed therefore, or the time specified when it will be sold.
5. No person or persons will be admitted to the pavilion, yards, tents, show ring, enclosure or roped off space while articles or stock are being judged, except one person in charge of horses, committee and judges, the latter two whom will wear distinct identification.
6. No exhibitor or attendant with an exhibit giving annoyance to the judge, or making use of insulting language to the committee, judge, or officials shall be liable to have his or her exhibit disqualified and/or be expelled from the grounds.
7. No exhibitor or his agent shall have any personal communications with the judge while in the execution of their duties, on it being proved that such communications has been held the exhibitor may be disqualified. Should any information be required by the judges it must be obtained through the stewards or the secretary.
8. Entries for all committee, who may decline to accept such entry without assigning any reason for doing so and entries for the exhibits in all classes are received by the judges, stewards, committee and that the decisions and awards may be given are final and not subject to any action of law.
9. Judges decision to be final.
10. The public must leave the building at 4.30pm after which time only the exhibitors will be admitted on presentation of entry cards for removal of exhibits.
11. No stock or other exhibits to be sold by auction on the ground unless it has been shown for competition, and not until 4.30pm and by permission of the subcommittee.
12. The fee for a site for the show shall not be less than \$35.00 and subject to conditions in class15.
13. No stand, tent or stall allowed on the ground unless applied for the fee set by the society to the secretary and paid in advance, no receipt will be recognized unless on the societies receipt and signed by the secretary or nominee of the society. The society reserves the right to refuse any person a stand or to cancel any stand or stall who cannot produce a receipt for the stand tent or stall by 11am will not be allowed to open and may be removed from the ground by the president secretary or any officer appointed by the society.
14. The president and the secretary or any appointed officer of the society shall have the power to enter any side show at any time they wish free of charge.
15. An area to be decided by the committee will be to exhibitors on which to display machinery, motors etc. which must not be removed until 4pm.
16. All entries close as per head on each section.
17. No steward shall influence a judge, but may assist in such capacity in any class.
18. Any exhibitor giving a wrong description of his or her exhibit with the intention of deceiving the society shall render such exhibit or exhibits liable to disqualification and the prize or prizes (if any) liable to forfeiture and may be debarred from exhibiting at any further show and exhibitors may be requested to make statutory declaration regarding their exhibits if the committee so desire.

19. Protests in all cases must be in writing and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$30.00 with the secretary, and may be forfeited not upheld and must be lodged with the secretary, within ONE HOUR of judging.
20. The society will not under any circumstances hold itself liable for any accident on the grounds or premises.
21. The society will not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss, damage to or mis-delivery of any exhibits or person property.
22. Exhibitors or their agents, if requested point out to stewards their respective exhibits in order that may be identified and numbered according to the catalogue, before being submitted to the judge.
23. Any prize awarded by the judge who may be withheld in consequence of valid protest, may be awarded to the exhibit next in order of merit.
24. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified the next in order of merit does not necessary obtain the prize. The committee with or without the advice of the judge shall decide the question.
25. Should a judge deem an entry unworthy of a prize the judge's opinion to be final. No exhibit necessarily awarded first prize.
26. Should there be any reason to subject that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous; the society reserves the right to refusing admittance to or removing the same from the ground at the expense of the exhibitor.
27. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the judges appointed by the society as to the merits of their exhibits and in case of protests alleged infringements of the regulations the decision of the committee shall be accepted as final, except an appeal to the association.
28. No entry will be received from any person disqualified by this society or by the Northern Agricultural Show Association during the period of such disqualification, and should any entry be accidentally accepted it shall when discovered be deemed void and the entry fee be forfeited.
29. The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse to accept any entry or having received same to refuse to allow the exhibit to compete without assigning any reason therefore.
30. Any matter not dealt with shall be decided by the committee concerned whose decision shall be final. Five to form a quorum.
31. Winners of cups and trophies which must be won more than once in order to become absolute property of the final winner will be held in trust by the society until trophy is won.
32. Any conditions or regulations printed in this prize list under the various sectional headings are to be construed as part of the regulations governing the conduct of the show of the society and equally binding on exhibitors

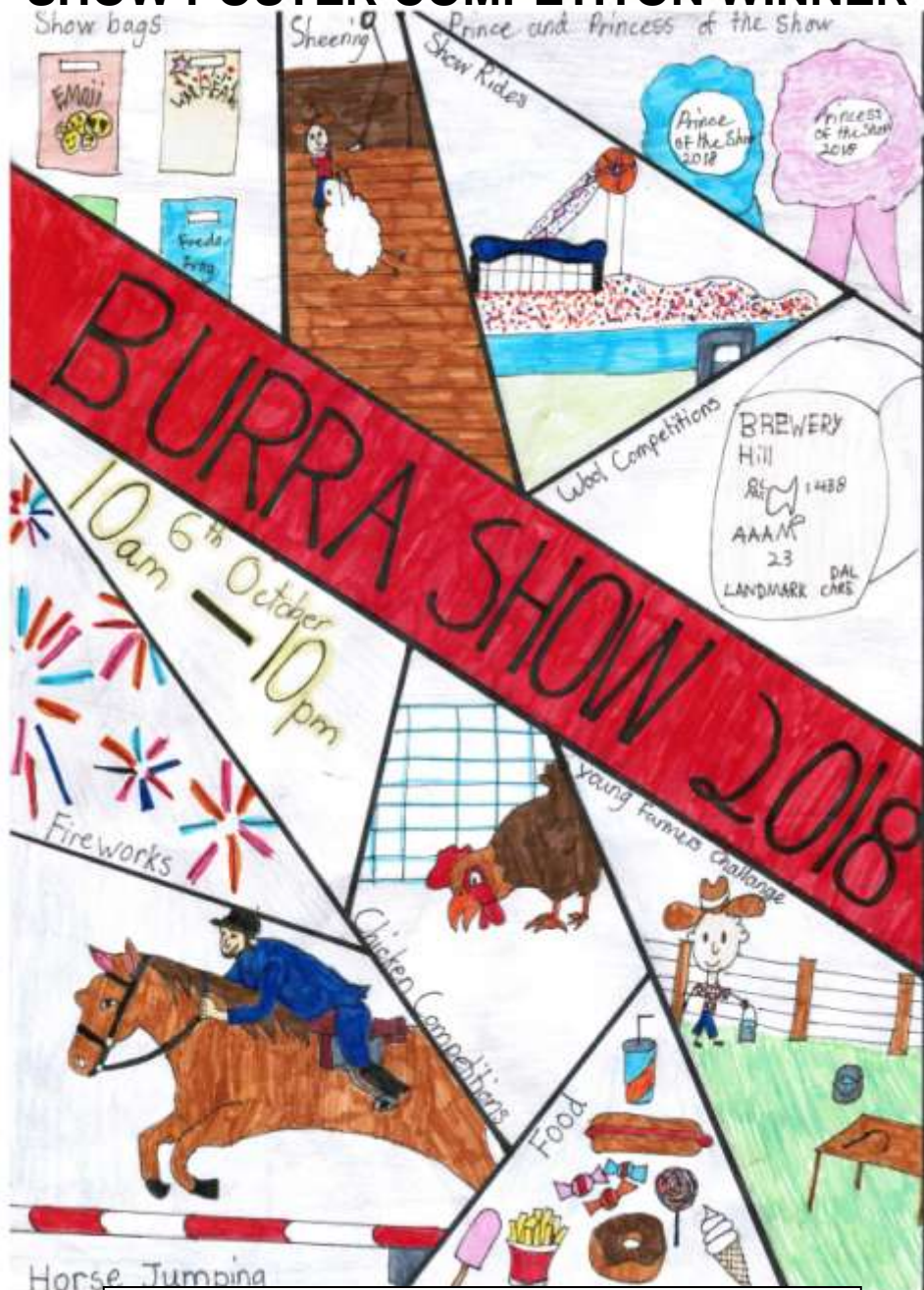
