



Grand Aggregate Trophies

- Adults must compete at a minimum of two (2) or more Northern Association Shows. If only one exhibitor in a class only one (1) point to be awarded.
- Sheep & cattle classes need only compete in two (2) Northern Association Shows.
- Juniors must compete at a minimum of two (2) Northern Association Shows.
- Aggregate Points to be calculated using 1st 5 points, 2nd 3 points, 3rd 1 point
- Adult age from the beginning of the year the exhibitor turns 18 years (& over)
- Junior age 5 to 17 years (from the beginning of the year the exhibitor turns 5 to the end of the year he/she turns 17)



Exhibitors may lock their cages on completion of judging (must supply own locks).

Exhibits to be penned by 9:45am for judging to commence at 10am. Exhibitors can remove birds from 4.30pm onwards, removal of any birds earlier then 4.30pm is with the permission and acknowledgment of the convenor. Presentation of champion birds at 4pm in the poultry shed. Birds may be exhibited with rings on providing there is no personal identification on them.

Exhibitors are requested to nominate breed & colour when filling out entry form. Diseased birds will be removed from shed and any eggs with be destroved.

All birds are the responsibility of the exhibitor and we encourage all exhibitors to water & feed their birds upon completion of judging .Birds may only be handled by the **Judge, Owner or Convenor**, if a problem arises with any bird .We encourage anyone with an interest in poultry or persons that are members of any poultry clubs to participate in the show.

Convenors and stewards are not responsible for any loss or damage.

 of insulting language to the committee, judge, or officials shall be liable to have his or
 her exhibit disqualified and/or be expelled from the grounds.
- No exhibitor or his agent shall have any personal communications with the judge while in the execution of their duties, on it being proved that such communications has been held the exhibitor may be disqualified. Should any information be required by the judges it must be obtained through the stewards or the secretary.
- Entries for all committee, who may decline to accept such entry without assigning any
 reason for doing so and entries for the exhibits in all classes are received by the judges,
 stewards, committee and that the decisions and awards may be given are final and not
 subject to any action of law.
- 9. Judges decision to be final.
- The public must leave the building at 4.30pm after which time only the exhibitors will be admitted for removal of exhibits.
- 11. No stock or other exhibits to be sold by auction on the ground unless it has been shown for competition, and not until 4.30pm and by permission of the subcommittee.
- 12. The fee for a site at the show shall beset by the committee and subject to conditions in the Tradesite application.
- No stand, tent or stall allowed on the ground unless applied for the fee set by the society to the secretary and paid in advance, no receipt will be recognized unless on the societies receipt and signed by the secretary or nominee of the society. The society reserves the right to refuse any person a stand or to cancel any stand or stall who cannot produce a receipt for the stand tent or stall by 11am will not be allowed to open and may be removed from the ground by the president secretary or any officer appointed by the society.
- 14. The president and the secretary or any appointed officer of the society shall have the power to enter any side show at any time they wish free of charge.
- An area to be decided by the committee will be to exhibitors on which to display machinery, motors etc. which must not be removed until 4pm.
- 16. All entries close as per head on each section.
- 17. No steward shall influence a judge, but may assist in such capacity in any class.
- 18. Any exhibitor giving a wrong description of his or her exhibit with the intention of deceiving the society shall render such exhibit or exhibits liable to disqualification and the prize or prizes (if any) liable to forfeiture and may be debarred from exhibiting at any further show and exhibitors may be requested to make statutory declaration regarding their exhibits if the committee so desire.

- Protests in all cases must be in writing and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$30.00 with the secretary, and may be forfeited if not upheld and must be lodged with the secretary, within ONE HOUR of judging.
- 20. The society will not under any circumstances hold itself liable for any accident on the grounds or premises.
- 21. The society will not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss, damage to or mis-delivery of any exhibits or person property.
- Exhibitors or their agents, if requested point out to stewards their respective exhibits in order that may be identified and numbered according to the catalogue, before being submitted to the judge.
- Any prize awarded by the judge who may be withheld in consequence of valid protest, may be awarded to the exhibit next in order of merit.
- 24. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified the next in order of merit does not necessary obtain the prize. The committee with or without the advice of the judge shall decide the question.
- 25. Should a judge deem an entry unworthy of a prize the judge's opinion to be final. No exhibit necessarily awarded first prize.
- 26. Should there be any reason that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous; the society reserves the right to refuse admittance to or remove the same from the ground at the expense of the exhibitor.
- 27. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the judges appointed by the society as to the merits of their exhibits and in case of protests alleged infringements of the regulations the decision of the committee shall be accepted as final, except an appeal to the association.
- 28. No entry will be received from any person disqualified by this society or by the Northern Agricultural Show Association during the period of such disqualification, and should any entry be accidentally accepted it shall when discovered be deemed void and the entry fee be forfeited.
- 29. The committee reserves the right to refuse to accept any entry or having received same to refuse to allow the exhibit to compete without assigning any reason.
- Any matter not dealt with shall be decided by the committee whose decision shall be final. Five to form a quorum.
- 31. Winners of cups and trophies will have their name engraved and the trophy will be held in trust by the society.
- 32. Any conditions or regulations printed in this prize list under the various sectional headings are to be construed as part of the regulations governing the conduct of the show of the society and equally binding on exhibitors
